Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we approach this year's Lenten Season the words of the Prophet Isaiah provide us with guidance and hope in a world that is attempting to come out of the past two years of isolation as we find our way into a new being. "See I am doing a new thing" are the words found in Isaiah 49:19.

We often find ourselves reacting to situations without much thought or responding day in and day out with the normal routine that is familiar and comfortable for us. During Lent we are called to enter into the practice of prayer, reflection and renewal. As we do so, we will see how God is at work within us and around us. We are invited to experience the transformation God is attempting in our lives, if we but get out of God's way and let God do a new thing within us.

Life happenings often get in our way of taking time to attend worship or be in community with others of our faith. Not only are we as individuals trying to understand how our lives have been changed over these past two years due to the pandemic, but how has it changed your relationship with God? The faith community at Jordan is also experiencing the same sense of the six "re" themes expressed in our scripture readings, as we return to more in person events, restore past services, programs and ministries as well as explore new ways that God is calling us to be church.

It takes each of us to conduct the ministries at Jordan as we seek to understand how God is doing a new thing(s) here at Jordan. As a community of faith, we made it through the pandemic keeping our head above the challenges. For that I give thanks to God and to each of you!

I invite you now to return to your faith community at Jordan Lutheran as God provides us with a sense of new hope in, around and through us, for indeed, "See God is doing a new thing!"
