Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We barely have the Christmas decorations put away and we are already facing Lent with Ash Wed on February 14^{th} ! Yes, Valentine's Day! With all the snow we have received already in January, I can't help but think about how the snowflakes and snow reminds me of Lent as we are cleansed of our sins and made new again.

I recently came across an article that made me stop and think about individual snowflakes. We know that no two snowflakes are alike. Doing some research back in January 1885 a man named Wilson Bentley, while living in Vermont photographed snowflakes. Now can you imagine the challenges without modern day photography techniques? But after successfully photographing over 5,000 snowflakes, he discovered no two were alike.

However, on the other hand in 1988, a scientist, Nancy Knight, flew in the sky over Wisconsin to do the same as Wilson Bentley did, photographing snowflakes but before they fell to the ground. Nancy Knight discovered that snowflakes are the same before they are battered by the wind and temperature changes descending to the ground.

Thinking about these two theories for Lent, we too are both alike and individualistic. We all are created in the image of God, yet we are all unique in our own ways from the makeup of our bodies to the individual characteristics that have shaped us through our years. We too have been shaped by the bumps and bruises of our life. Some bumps and bruises are caused by our own doing by the choices we made; others are through the encounters we have with others in our life, the positive and negative affects people and experiences have on us.

As we prepare for Lent, may we be reminded of the purity in the image of God that we were created. And may the redeeming grace of Christ's love for us, who sees us both with the pureness of a newly shaped snowflake and yet also with our individuals beings as we have been bumped and bruised throughout life, through Christ's love we are made new again, refreshed as fresh as the newly white fallen snow, snowflakes piled upon each other; snowflakes joined together to create beauty that will never be replicated.

May the love of Christ and his redeeming grace, unify us to create beauty in our world, sharing with others Christ's forgiveness of sins, as we are washed in His grace! I invite you to join us for worship on Sunday mornings as well as our Wednesday midweek Lenten services, as we reflect on our relationship with God and one another as a community of faith.

Family Promise

Jordan Lutheran is one of fifteen host congregations with Family Promise of Lehigh Valley (FPLV). FPLV is a non-emergency, 90 day shelter program for families with minor children experiencing situational homelessness. We host up to four families four weeks a year at Jordan. For each week that we host - daily at 6:30pm families are driven to Jordan in the bus from the Day Center, at 1346 Hamilton Blvd in Allentown, where we feed them dinner, provide fellowship and a warm safe place to sleep. At 6am, the guests take the bus back to the Day Center to start their day.

Jordan Lutheran and St Joseph the Worker have partnered to host eight (8) weeks at Jordan in 2024. The 2024 hosting weeks are - Jan 21 & 28, Feb 25 & Mar 3, Aug 4 & 11, & Nov 3 & 10.

We also picked up one last week in 2023 – the week of December 31.

Clothing Drive Continues


