



Dear Beloved in Christ,

Here in the northern part of our county, we are beginning to see signs of the changes of the season as we leave summer behind and enter into the season of fall. Many of us who live in this area often say we wouldn't live in any other place that doesn't have four seasons.

Yet, we complain when there is change in our life and especially when there are changes in our life around our faith community, and yet again our Lutheran heritage was founded on exactly that, a call for change in the life of the church!

In 1517, when Martin Luther wrote the ninety-five theses (statements) and posted them on the door of the Wittenburg Church in Germany, Luther was calling for changes according to what he and others thought would enhance the faith of the people as a whole, not necessarily for himself. God only knows the anguish and threats put on his life in the name of change!

Our world and culture have evolved significantly since Luther's time and for the most part we have enjoyed the changes and updates that hopefully have made our living a bit easier. But it may not have always been for the better – i.e., technology that separates us from being socially interactive with one another causing us to lose the skills set of knowing how to treat and care for one another, how to communicate in a healthy manner.

Our world has been hit hard in the past years by covid and we continue to recover in so many aspects of our life. Here at Jordan (as with other faith communities), we are seeing a decline in the number of volunteers for simple things such as worship volunteers in all aspects, yet people want two services. Our society has become a more anti-organized religion, and not just among the young folk. Older folks are finding that too, no longer committing to membership at a congregation, but scanning through worship services online or simply not participating at all.

Our economic situation in our country continues to be a battle, as the rich get richer and the poor get poorer (as the old cliché goes). More and more people are interpreting the Bible through the lens of what they hear through the political realm in our country, instead of the other way around.

Change is inevitable and can be healthy! Without change, there is stagnation and death. Can you imagine still worshipping in the language and format of Luther's time? Change is inevitable and is needed!

However, change often brings about a sense of fear. What will happen if I don't like the change? What if a change affects "My" daily/weekly routine? When we turn inward and only consider our own concerns about change, we lose the identity of what it means to be the church, to be the body of Christ working together to fulfill the mission of Christ in learning and spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ to a world that so desperately needs healing and unity.

On Sunday, October 29<sup>th</sup> we will observe Re-form-ation Sunday, in remembrance of our 506 years of Lutheran heritage and the call for change that Martin Luther proposed in 1517. Please join us for worship, not only on the 29<sup>th</sup>, but each Sunday as we are called to gather together as the body of Christ, uniting in spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ!
